

MEMBER GUIDELINES 2009

Enrolment Procedure

Anyone interested in becoming a member at Toi Ora must phone 360 4171 to make an appointment for an orientation before starting the programme. You are welcome to bring support person to your orientation.

Key Support Person

When members join Toi Ora they will be asked to register a key support person as part of their enrolment. This enrolment form must be updated each term. It is expected that all users actively involve this key support person and Auckland's mental health services in maintaining their wellness.

If anyone using the centre is becoming unwell then the paid staff of Toi Ora Live Art Trust will encourage them to contact appropriate services and their key support person. If the user does not make this contact (or is unable to make this contact) then the paid staff member of Toi Ora Live Art Trust will contact the key support person on their behalf.

Care of Artwork

Members are responsible for the care of their artwork. Members are advised to name their artwork and keep it in a named folder if they choose to leave it at Toi Ora. Storage of artwork at home is recommended.

Unacceptable behaviour at Toi Ora Live Art Trust is defined as:

- Physical violence
- Swearing
- Sexual Harassment of any person
- Bullying
- The wearing of gang patches
- Racism, sexism, homophobia
- Verbal violence i.e. abusive language directed in anger at another person or directed in anger at an object and so upsetting someone present.
- Deliberate and /or unsafe misuse of centre property
- Being under the influence of/ or in possession of drugs and/or alcohol on the property.
- Interference with other peoples belongings or art work
